
Easy Read



This is an Easy Read version of some information. It may not include all of the information but it will tell you about the important parts.




This Easy Read booklet uses easier words and pictures. Some people may still want help to read it.

Who we are looking for



In Motion is looking to support composers.

By **composers**, we mean anyone who creates art using music or sound - you might make the music yourself or write it for others.

You must:



• Be interested in trying out new ways of making music.



 Be able to think about your work and how you could work in a better way.



• Be in charge of your own learning to get the most out the project.



We want to help artists to take the next big step in their job.



This might be something like:

• Making music in a new way.



 Making music for new groups of people who might not have heard your work before.



• Working more on music that you make on your own.



 Bringing together different parts of your work that were not connected before. A big step in your career might also be something like:



• Finding out what success means to you in your work.



• Learning more about how you work and your own needs.



• Making bigger work, or work that will be heard by more people.

A big step in your career might also be something like:



• Taking **risks** in your work with support from others.

A **risk** is when you do something without knowing what is going to happen.



 Working with other artists who you have not worked with before.



 Working with new kinds of music that you have not worked with before.

How to apply



There are 2 stages to applying for support from In Motion.



The first stage is open to anyone.



We will then ask certain people to complete stage 2.

In stage 1, you will send us:



• Some information about who you are, like your name and address.



• A short piece of writing up to 250 words about you, called a bio.


Tell us about how you make art



We would like you to tell us about how you are getting on with your art right now.



Answer the questions on the next page to help us understand how you make art.



In no more than 250 words, please tell us:

What is important in your work right now?



 What is working well and what is not working well?



In stage 1, you will also send us:

• Information about the big change in your music you want to make, in no more than 250 words.



• Information about how your art would be different by the end of the project, in no more than 250 words.



• 2 examples of your work.



You need to send us your application. by 3 November 2025.

We will tell everyone if they can apply for stage 2 by 17 December 2025.



If we do not ask you to apply for stage 2, you can ask us for the reasons why.



You can send your application online using an Airtable form.



Or you can choose how you want to send your answers.

You might want to send your answers as:



• Writing.



• A short video.



• A short sound recording.



If you cannot apply online, you can apply in a different way.

To apply, you must:

• Be over 18 years old.



 Not be in education of any kind between April 2026 and November 2027.



• Have lived in the UK for the last 2 years.



• Plan to live in the UK until at least November 2027.




• Send us 2 recordings of your work.




 Have **not** got money from one of our other projects in the last 6 months.
